Programme delivery

Burn Care MSc - 2 years, part-time
Burn Care PGCert - 1 year, part-time

- Web-based, distance-learning, part-time

Through our online learning platform we deliver reading material, key papers and student/tutor discussion forums.

- Multi-media material delivers video discussions, lectures and surgical techniques
- Regular, live on-line tutorials are delivered by the course contributors

- Clinical days (2 per year) are organized for our students, taking place in both UK and/or international centers. These are not a compulsory element of the course
- An on-site OSCE (Objective Structured Clinical Examination) will be held at the end of each academic year.

Distance Learning

The course has been designed so that students can continue working full-time in their current employment whilst studying the degree. A succinct material delivery format and realistic assignment deadlines are structured to allow students to pace their work accordingly. Typically students will need to allocate 4 – 6 hours of study per week.

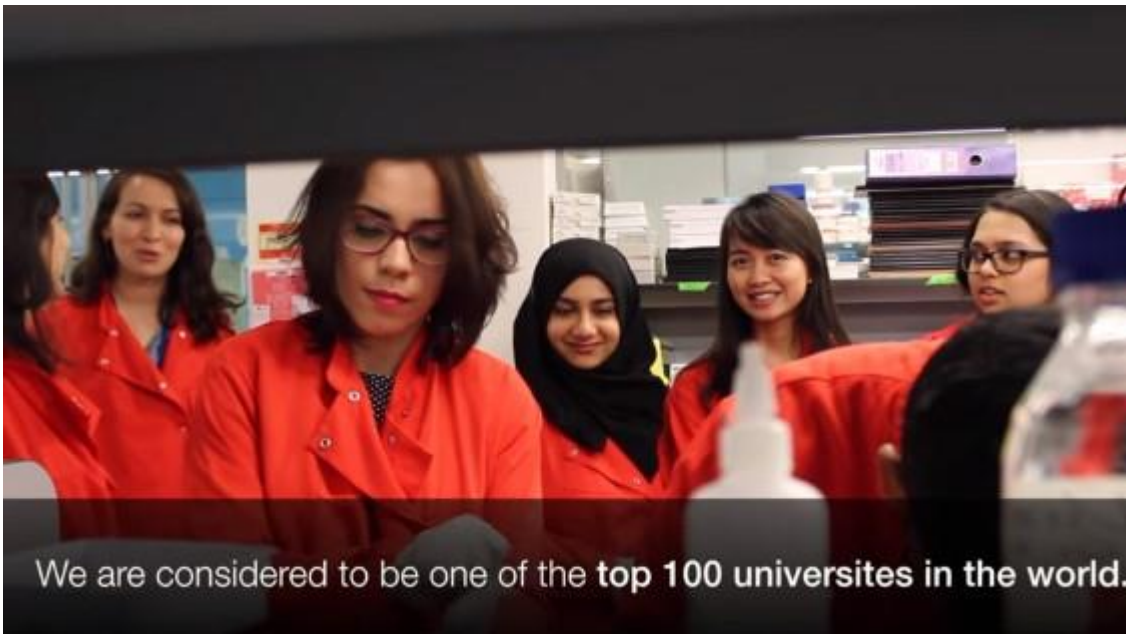
